To BE Christ in this neighborhood


- To treat people as Jesus would

# The Name of God

- We call God Father...
  - first origin of everything
  - at the same time: loving caregiver

 "God's parental tenderness can also be expressed by the image of Mother..."

- "The language of faith draws on the human experience of parents.
- But... human parents are fallible and can disfigure the face of fatherhood and motherhood...
- God transcends the human distinction between the sexes. He is neither man nor woman God is just God."



# God is still speaking

A tremendous and amazing reality

God is speaking to us individually

- As well as through scripture & liturgy
  - And the whole ministry of the Church



## Pierre Teilhard de Chardin SJ

"God is not remote from us.

He is at the point of my pen, my pick, my paintbrush, my needle —

and my heart and my thoughts."



- At Vatican II:
- God is acting in people's lives
- The only thing we can do about that
- is to help people discern what God is asking of us in this moment
  - Discernment
  - Accompaniment
  - Prayer

# Rahner

- This discernment occurs
  - within the church but also outside it

- Many whom God has, the church does not have
- Many whom the church has, God does not have


### Discernment

- What is God asking of this person in this particular situation?
  - This doesn't change church law
  - It doesn't apply to everyone
  - It's THIS person and their specific, concrete situation in life
    - Given the mitigating circumstances
    - And the limits they face in life




# Pastoral Strategy

Pope Francis sees accompaniment



- The key strategy
  - In order to help people discern God's voice within their hearts

# Accompaniment

- One Christian helping another to
  - Grow in intimacy with Jesus
  - & love the Church
- Find their way through the muddles which life presents
- Not the sole task of the clergy
  - Lay people have a key role to play

# The Church in Modern World #16 Our Catechism #1776

- Deep within our conscience we discove a law which we have not laid upon ourselves but which we must obey.
- Its voice, ever calling us to love and to do what is good and to avoid evil, sounds in our hearts at the right moment....
- For we have in our heart a law inscribed by God....
- Our conscience is our most secret core and our sanctuary. There we are alone with God whose voice echoes in our depths.

# Our Catechism #1785

- In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path,
  - we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice.
- We must also examine our conscience before the Lord's Cross.
- We are assisted by the gifts of the Holy Spirit,
- aided by the witness or advice of others
- and guided by the authoritative teaching of the Church.



# An accompanist

- Helps others hear the voice of God as it echoes in the depths of his or her conscience
- With reverence for how God may be leading this person
  - Fully aware of the mysterious ways of God
  - Such accompaniment happens at "God's speed" (not at our own demanding pace)



# Who needs accompaniment?

- Those in irregular marriage situations
  - Who want full communion
- Those seeking a deeper life in Christ
  - Who want the happiness that comes from self-giving love
- Those who are passing through one of life's difficult moments
  - Who want support and assurance

What do we teach about who can and who cannot be made welcome?

# **Apostolic Exhortation**

- Used by the Popes to express their thoughts on contemporary issues
- No doctrinal or binding character
  - not like an "Apostolic Constitution"
  - or a "Motu proprio"

More like an extended sermon



# **Apostolic Exhortation**

- The contents are part of the ordinary magisterium of the Church,
  - As such, they call for our assent



- [The Church] turns with love
- to those who participate in an incomplete manner...
- The Church must accompany with attention and care the weakest of her children
- who show signs of a wounded and troubled love



- by restoring in them hope and confidence,
  - like the beacon of a lighthouse in a port
  - or a torch carried among the people

"...the Church's task is often like that of a field hospital."



- Remarriage (JoL 292)
  - Constructive elements of love
  - Even though not up to the ideal
- Civil marriage or cohabitation (JoL 293)
  - Stability and care are present
  - Deep affection and shared children
  - Let us enter into dialogue with these
  - In the hope that they will gradually...(JoL 295)



(JoL 296-299)

- The way of the Church is not to condemn anyone
- But to walk with them
- Avoid judgements that do not take into account mitigating circumstances

Should not feel excommunicated



#### When people fail

- Do we cast them off?
- Or work to reinstate them? (JoL 296)
- No one can be condemned forever

- Not only the divorced & remarried
- "But everyone in whatever situation they find themselves" (JoL 297)



#### The logic of integration

- They belong to us
- Because they belong to Christ
- ...not excommunicated (JoL 299)

What is needed is discernment of how God is speaking in their consciences. (JoL 300)



(JoL 300)

- ...direct the pastors of the Church to undertake discernment of each case,
- the degree of responsibility is not the same in all cases
- and, therefore, the rules may be applied differently
- We must accompany each person...





#### Situations

- 2<sup>nd</sup> union consolidated over time
- Tried to save 1<sup>st</sup> marriage but were abandoned
- Enter the 2<sup>nd</sup> marriage for the kids
- Subjectively certain in conscience that the 1st marriage was not valid
- Violence, abuse, drugs, addiction



#### Many situations...

- If we consider the immense variety of concrete situations such as those I have mentioned...
- No new set of rules
- that would adequately apply to all cases
- is possible...
  - **#**300



#### What is possible

(JoL 300)

- ...is a process of accompaniment and discernment
- which guides the faithful
- to an awareness of their situation before God."



**JoL #292** 

- The Church has a very strong reason for teaching what it does about divorce
  - The New Testament teaches about it
  - It is in continuity with our history
  - It calls for self-giving, Paschal Mystery love

 And yet, a couple could discern that they are meeting these demands, even when a divorce or 2<sup>nd</sup> marriage results



#### Mitigating circumstances #36

- The Church has a solid body of reflection
- that helps us understand mitigating circumstances
- ...we can no longer say, simply, that any person in an irregular situation
- is in a state of mortal sin or is deprived of sanctifying grace.

#### Mitigating circumstances #302

- Ignorance
- Inadvertence
- Duress
- Fear
- Habit
- Inordinate attachments
- Psychological or
   Social factors. CCC 1735

- Affective immaturity
- Force of habit
- Conditions of anxiety

 Other factors that lessen or even extenuate moral culpability. CCC 2352



#303

- A person can come to see that a particular decision is in line with "what God himself is asking"
- amid the concrete complexity of one's specific situation
  - while yet not fully the objective ideal



Joy of the Love #37

- We have stressed
  - Doctrine
  - Bioethics
  - Moral issues
- But not grace
  - Marriage as a dynamic pathway to personal development and fulfillment
  - Where is God leading you in this marriage?



- We also find it hard to make room for the consciences of the faithful,
- who very often respond as best they can...
   and are capable of carrying out their own discernment in complex situations.
- We have been called to form consciences, not to replace them.
  - Joy of Love #37



#### Discernment

**JoL #305** 

- "Discernment must help to find possible ways of responding to God and growing
  - in the midst of limits,"

- It's usually not black and white
- Don't close off the way of grace



- For this reason, no pastor should ever believe that it is enough to simply apply a moral law to people in irregular situations without regard to conscience,
- as though throwing stones at people's lives.

"This shows the closed heart of one hiding behind Church teachings."

### Joy of Love #305

- Because of mitigating factors,
- it is possible that in an objective situation of sin
- a person may not be subjectively guilty;
- this person can be living in God's grace,
- can love and can also grow in the life of grace and charity,
- while receiving the Church's help to this end



- In certain cases, this can include the help of the sacraments.
- Hence, "I want to remind priests that the confessional must not be a torture chamber, but rather an encounter with the Lord's mercy" JoG 44
- I would also point out that the Fucharist "is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak" JoG 47.



 "Those... who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin,

are not to be admitted to holy communion."



- If there is no mortal sin:
- "Any baptized person who is not forbidden by law

may and must be admitted to holy communion."



#### Pope Francis

**JoL 308** 

- "I understand those who prefer a more rigorous pastoral care which leaves no room for confusion.
- But I sincerely believe that Jesus wants a Church
- attentive to the goodness which the Holy
   Spirit sows
- in the midst of human weakness,



- Francis wants to reach hearts and souls
- He wants to influence them
- Very much like the Fathers of the Church
- This began at Vatican II
- And Pope Francis is continuing it now
- He is raising up the ideal of Catholic life
- Knowing not everyone is able to live it

#### Rhetorical style

- So he isn't laying out laws to follow
- But ideals to be lived up to
  - Gradually
  - As one is able
  - Given one's limits
  - And the circumstances of one's life
- Reality is more important than ideas



#### Jesus accompanied Matthew

- Jesus called Matthew
- Jesus looked on that man with mercy #8 in The Face of Mercy

- Pope Francis' motto:
  - Miserando ataue Eliaendo
  - I hold nothing against you and I choose you



# What can you as a parish do with this?



- Usually a parish would
  - Study current pastoral theology
    - Maybe 2-3 months
    - Reading & study groups
  - Make a decision as a parish
    - To embrace accompaniment more fully
    - A public, well-understood decision
  - Do some planning about how each part of the parish will pick this up



#### For our parishioners

- Every parish priest
- Your paid and volunteer team
  - Formation, pastoral care, liturgy
  - Communications, welcoming, facilities
- Spouses for each other
  - Within the home
- A community of accompanists



- Each case is about a person before God
- You are not changing church teaching because you offer a particular bit of mercy
- Your address is to each person
  - Not to the rest of the church
  - Each person is your subject
  - What is God asking of her or him in this situation?
  - How can you help him or her discern that?



## We accompanying folks...

- People discerning their primary relationships
- Pastoral care situations
  - Illness, dying, sadness, loss, change
- Faith formation
  - Young couples with kids
- As a whole parish
  - Especially in liturgy



### We accompany

- Parents accompany their kids
- Children accompany older parents
- Spouses with one another
- Friends
- Neighbors
- Fellow parishioners at STM



- A way of walking with one another
- That leads to a more genuine faith
  - Living what we believe:
    - Forgiveness
    - A way to manage our wealth
    - How we treat the immigrant and refugee
    - Shared meals and intimate conversation
    - The presence of the Lord in our midst
    - Hearing God's voice echo in our souls



# How is accompaniment done? What is the method?

6 steps



- You sit down with someone
- And walk then through theological reflection & discernment

- Theological Reflection:
- Seeking to hear what God may be asking of us in a given situation



- Make yourself available
- 2) Invite the seeker to tell their story
- 3) Listen carefully
- 4) Inquire and nudge just a little
- Help them discern what God is asking of them
- 6) Help them reach a decision



- Make yourself available
- Let it be widely know that all are welcome
  - That no one will be judged or punished
  - That each one's story is valuable
- Become known as the place where people are safe to talk



### The 2<sup>nd</sup> Step

- Someone (the seeker)
- Comes to see you (the accompanist)
  - In the school or among the parents
  - Formal or informal
- Invite them to tell their story
  - Listen with "the ears of God"
  - Clarify only a little
  - Don't interfere with their story

# The 3<sup>rd</sup> Step

- Listen
- Don't judge them
  - Or at least temper your judgments
- Don't throw verses of Scripture at them
- Don't quote the Catechism

Let them talk



#### As an accompanist

- God is working in this person's life
- It's a mystery
- Learn to trust that
- And even to remove your sandals in reverence

This takes us to the 4<sup>th</sup> step



- The Art of Sacred Inquiry
- Gently nudge
  - with open questions
  - help the seeker clarify his or her heart
- Don't be intrusive
- And allow for God's time
  - This may take many weeks or longer



### In the back of your mind

- Keep in mind as you listen
- Three sources of wisdom
  - The stories from Scripture
  - Church teaching
  - The culture of this person
    - and the "signs of the times"



- Keep in mind the stories and teachings of Jesus
- Pray with imaginative prayer
  - Placing yourself in the story
  - Hearing the Lord speak to you

How would Jesus respond to this situation or decision?



#### The Call to Holiness

- How are you called to die to yourself?
- How is that call embedded in this situation?
  - A call to forgive
  - To be generous
  - To always choose love over hate
  - To be non-judgmental
  - To turn the other cheek



### Church teaching

How does this decision or situation measure up to what we teach?

How do our teachings inform and guide this decision?



### Church teaching

- If not perfectly up to the ideal,
  - How can you reconcile yourself to this?
  - How does your "exception" fit into the values the Church has?

- To depart from a teaching
- Is not to dissent from it

#### Signs of the Times

#### Biblical directive

 Matthew 16: know how to read the signs of the times

#### Church directive

- Church in the Modern World #4
- Signa temporum perscrutandi
- News, medicine, psychology, sociology
- What call is embedded in them?



### Why the signs of the times?

In order to interpret them in the light of the Gospel

- Because these are the times in which your parishioners are living
- They aren't living in the 1950s any longer..., for example



#### Method for Scrutinizing this Age

- In prayerful theological reflection
- Ask questions of the times

- How does this or that development or situation inform our lives of faith?
- Does this reflect the teaching of Jesus and the Gospels?



### Pope Francis

Sep 4, 2015

- Don't condemn everything that you find in the signs of our times
  - In truth, everything was NOT better in past years
  - It's all moving along with God's hand
- But don't consecrate everything either
  - Not every new bit is a good one
  - Avoid casting out what is old arbitrarily



- How does advancing human knowledge in medicine and psychology inform what we teach now about
  - Birth control
  - Same sex orientations
  - Capital punishment
  - The care of the earth
  - The place of women
  - Marriage and married people in ministry



- How does our understanding of what Jesus teaches in Matthew 25
  - Inform our thinking about immigrants today in our society
  - Inform how we help the poor
- How does Jesus' encounter with the rich young man
  - Inform what we do with our own money



- Make yourself available
- 2) Invite the seeker to tell their story
- 3) Listen carefully
- 4) Inquire and nudge just a little
- Help them discern what God is asking of them

## The 5<sup>th</sup> Step

- Discernment
- With all this in mind:
  - The story of the seeker
  - Your sacred inquiry and gentle nudges
    - About Jesus, the Church, and the culture
- What is God asking of this person
  - In this particular, concrete situation?
  - (This doesn't change Church law)



#### Discernment

- Ask the seeker to be attentive
  - What are you hearing in the depths of your conscience?
  - What is God asking of you?

- Be attentive to feelings of Consolation
- Or Desolation



- Consolation
  - Focus outside & beyond ourselves
  - See the joys and sorrows of other people
  - Bonds us more closely to our community
  - Refreshes our inner vision
  - Shows us where God is active in our lives and where God is leading us
    - Releases new energy in us



- Desolation
  - Turns us in on ourselves
    - Drives us ever deeper into our negative feelings
  - Cuts us off from community
  - Makes us want to give up on the things that used to be important to us
  - Prevents us from hearing God
    - Drains us of energy



#### The Power of Darkness

- If the seeker seems to reach
  - A decision to be violent or abusive
  - Against life and for death
  - Hate and prejudice

- The accompanist may need to speak up
- God does not call anyone to these

# The 6<sup>th</sup> Step

- Reach a decision
  - Accompaniment happens in God's time
  - For some, very quickly
  - For others, much more time
- Listen with faith for God's voice
  - Reach a point of believing:
  - This is what God is calling me to in this moment



#### Restoration

- How will this person be welcomed into the life of the parish?
  - It may need to be quiet
  - Follow pastoral guidelines
- Invite the seeker to help identify this

Discernment leads to action



#### Review the steps

- Make yourself available
- 2) Invite the seeker to tell their story
- 3) Listen carefully
- 4) Inquire and nudge just a little
- 5) Help them discern what God is asking of them
- 6) Help them reach a decision and enjoy full life in the community



- What's next?
  - This isn't a "new program"
  - It's not like Alpha or RENEW or other programs
  - It's a way of living the Gospel
  - As individuals within the parish family
  - We insert it into everything we do



#### So what's next?

- Study and get to know the pastoral theology behind this
  - Small groups
  - Within your existing ministry groups
- Decide to make this your "identity"
- Name someone to guide you
- Begin educating everyone
